



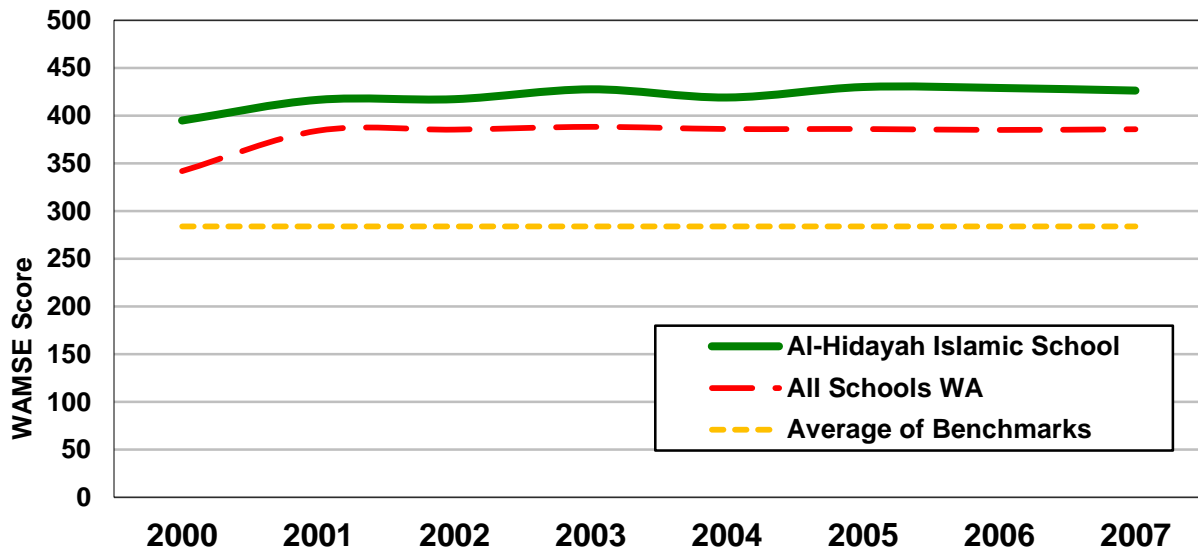

## School Performance Information 2010

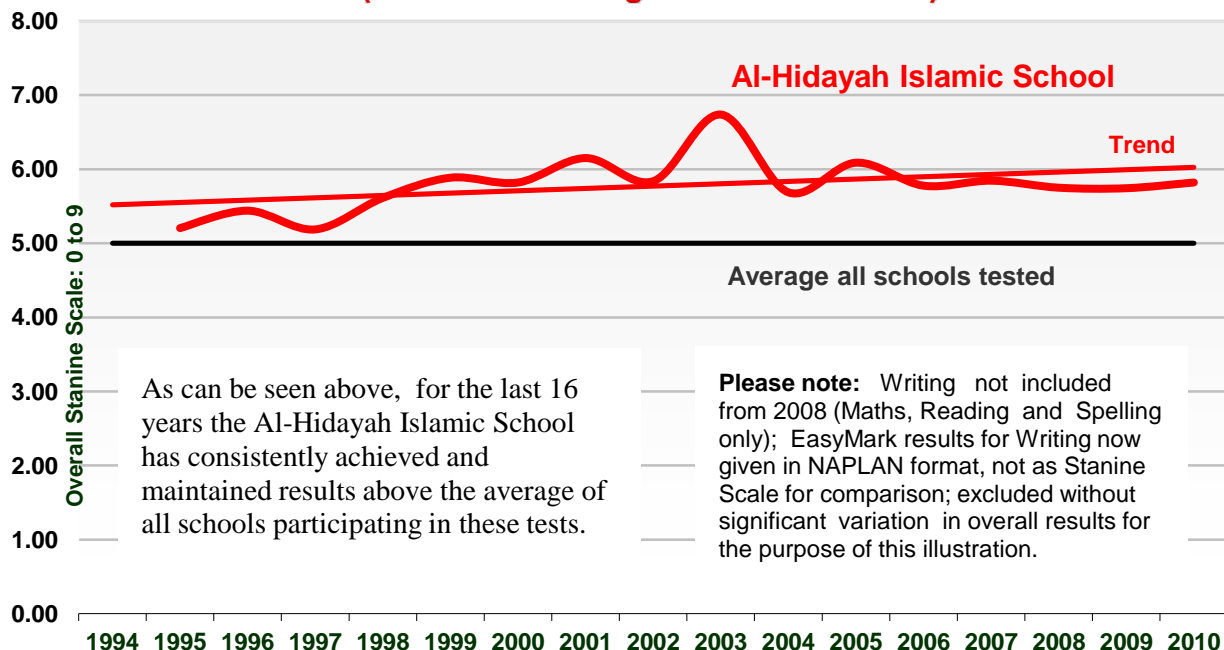
### Value Added Results:

WALNA (Western Australian Literacy and Numeracy Testing) and Easymark results show that Al-Hidayah students are maintaining above average academic standards in literacy and numeracy year after year. Overall WALNA results from 2000 to 2007 are given below:

As can be seen above, for the last 16 years the Al-Hidayah Islamic School has consistently achieved and maintained results above the average of all schools participating in these tests.

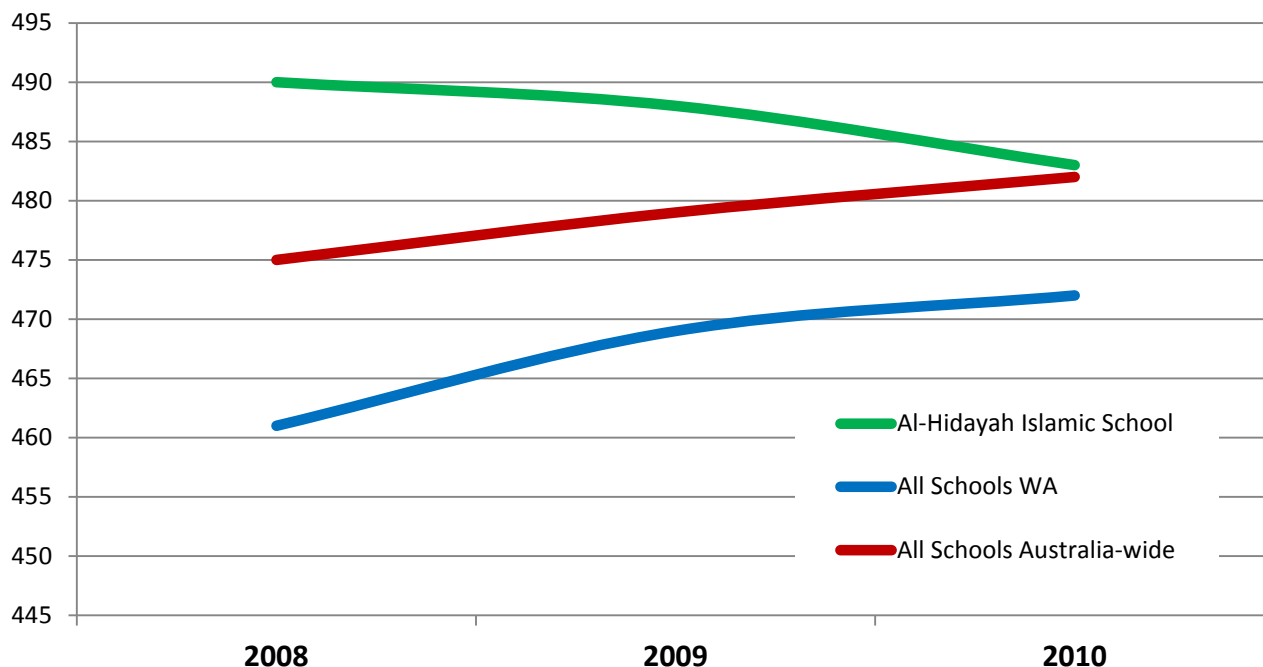

#### **Student Attendance:**

The average student attendance rate was **92%** during 2010.

#### **Parent, Student and Teacher Satisfaction:**

Overall general comments and feedback suggest that most of the parents, students and teachers remained **satisfied** with the school's performance during 2010.

#### **Average Staff Attendance Rate:**

The average staff attendance rate was **98%** during 2010.

#### **Staff Retention:**

**82%** of teaching staff members were retained in 2010 from 2009.

#### **Teacher Qualifications:**

All of our class teachers are fully trained and registered with WACOT (Western Australian College of Teaching). Five of our teachers hold Bachelor of Education degrees. Two teachers hold University Degrees and Diplomas of Education. One teacher holds a PhD and Diploma of Education. All of the religion teachers are registered LAT (Limited Authority to Teach) with WACOT and have religious qualifications / knowledge.

#### **Expenditure and Teacher Participation in Professional Learning**

All teachers participated in professional learning activities in areas like Literacy, Assessment, Numeracy, and Cross-Curricular topics such as linking Science with Literacy, LOTE (Languages other than English), Classroom Behaviour Management and Legal issues. The amount spent on staff training and development for 2009 was \$4,037.77. Most of the professional development courses were sponsored by AISWA (the Association of Independent Schools, Western Australia).
